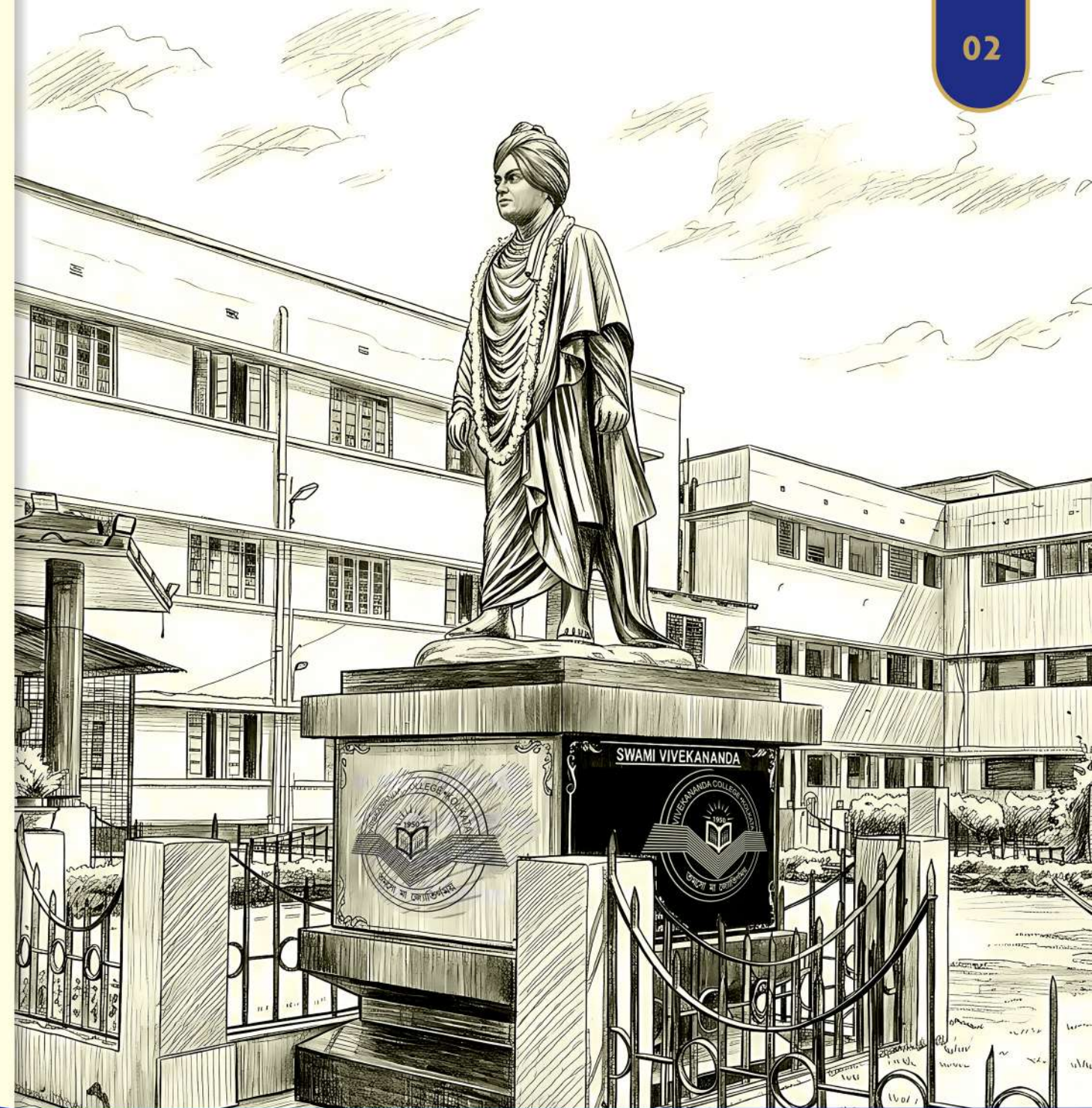
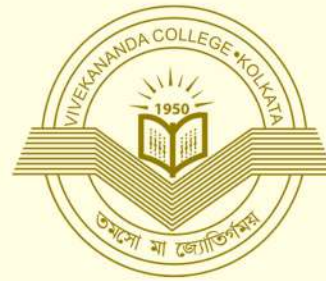

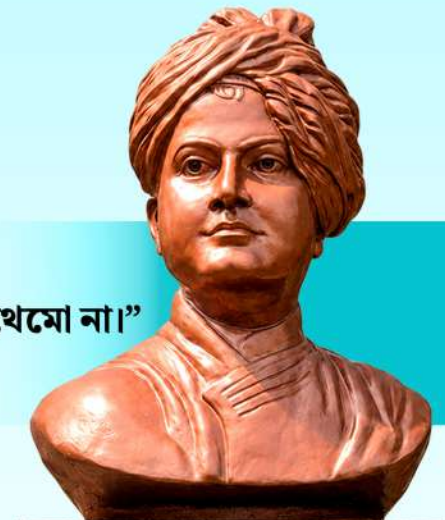

Swami Vivekananda Merit cum Means Scholarship

Swami Vivekananda Merit-cum-Means Scholarship – Students who have passed their last qualifying examination in the year 2026, 2025, 2024, or 2023 (including those who could not get admission in 2025, 2024, or 2023 due to unavoidable reasons and are taking admission in the year of this advertisement) with at least 60% marks in aggregate from the West Bengal Board of Secondary Education, West Bengal Council for Higher Secondary Education, or Madrasa Education for Higher Secondary level or Undergraduate level are eligible for this scholarship. The upper ceiling for family income has been fixed at ₹2,50,000 per annum.

Kanyashree Prakalpa (K1& K2)

Kanyashree-1 (K1): Reading in 8th or above class in a government recognized regular educational institution and 13 to 18 years unmarried girls within the age limit are given financial assistance at the rate of Rs.1000 per annum.

Kanyashree-2 (K2): At the time of enrollment and application in the above institution, more than 18 years but under 19 years of age a one-time financial grant of Rs. 25,000 is given to unmarried girls.

Aikyashree Scholarship

Under this scheme, the Post-Matric Scholarship is awarded to students pursuing studies from Class XII onwards, with a minimum of 50% marks required in the last examination. The Talent Support Program (TSP) provides a stipend to minority students who have passed their last final examination with less than 50% marks but are continuing their studies in government or non-government schools, colleges, or universities from Class XII onwards. The Swami Vivekananda Merit-cum-Means Scholarship (SVMCM) is given to meritorious minority students pursuing regular courses from Class XII to Postgraduation level, requiring a minimum of 60% marks from Higher Secondary to Graduation level, and 53% marks for Post-graduation level as well as for Honours subjects at Graduation level.

Oasis Scholarship

A West Bengal Government post-matric scholarship for SC, ST, and OBC students. It covers tuition fees and provides a maintenance allowance. Eligible students must have a family income of not more than ₹2.5 lakh per annum.

Institutional Merit Scholarship

College-level scholarship for academically outstanding students based on first -year results.
